

COVID RESPONSE PLAN

In addition to the SHP (Sonoma Horse Park) Health Protocol, and USEF Action Plan for Returning to Competition, the following Covid Response Plan will be followed should any individual on the Show Grounds present with suspected symptoms of Covid-19 or test positive for Covid-19 during the show.

General Precautions and Requirements under SHP and USEF Protocols

- Social Distancing (6 feet between individuals) must be followed at all times.
- Masks/Face Coverings must be worn except when mounted (required by State of California).
- Monitor temperature daily. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5 or higher should not enter the show grounds (per USEF).
- All Individuals entering the Show Office and VIP will have their temperature taken by a SHP Staff member. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5 will be asked to leave the show grounds. *See below for additional information.*
- All requirements as listed above regarding social distancing, wearing of masks, and temperature monitoring must be followed in the RV Area.
- Access to the Stabling Area will be restricted to Essential Personnel - veterinarians, equine caretakers (grooms), trainers and riders.

Specific Protocol to be followed in the case of a suspected Covid-19 individual on grounds during Competition Hours

- An individual found to have a temperature of 99.5 or higher upon entering the Show Grounds, but does not show any other symptoms of Covid-19 (*see Symptom List below*) will be asked to leave the Show Grounds.
- The individual should avoid contact with others and may not return to the Show Grounds until the following day, and may only return if the fever has fully dissipated and the individual has experienced no other symptoms of Covid-19.

Important USEF Regulations

While Show Management is available to address any questions or concerns on the Covid-19 Response Plan, it is important for all individuals to note the following requirements of USEF.

Under USEF Rules, and as printed in the USEF Action Plan for Return to Competition:

“The Competition Organizer has the authority under GR 702.1 and GR914 to remove from the facility any person who does not comply with the regulations and requirements in effect at the competition..... Participants are required to comply with these and any additional Competition Organizer requirements at all times while present on competition grounds. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the grounds.”

CDC Symptoms of Covid-19

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after exposure to the virus.**

People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Look for emergency warning signs for COVID-19. If someone is showing any of these signs, seek emergency medical care immediately. Call 911 or call ahead to your local emergency facility and notify the operator that you are seeking care for someone who has or may have COVID-19.

Emergency Warning Signa

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Inability to wake or stay awake
- Bluish lips or face
